We recently had the 24th Annual Scientific Meeting of the Australasian College of Phlebology in Fiji. It was a fabulous and successful meeting, featuring invited speakers – Dr Christopher Pittman, Phlebologist from Tampa, Florida and Dr Chris Rogan, Interventional Radiologist and Chair of IRSA, Australia.

The meeting saw some landmark consensus discussions about Intra-arterial injection in venous procedures and how to manage these difficult cases. addition, In presentation of potentially industry changing lab based research about cyanoacrylate and some dvnamic presentations about AI and digital health.

We were supported by our sponsors and trade exhibitors. Pelvic venous disorders were featured and the trainees were supported with a training session, ultrasound and endovenous workshop sessions. The location was idyllic and enjoyed by all.

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of Dr Stefania Roberts and Dr Steve Benson, the ACP in conjunction with Youth With a Mission (YWAM) and local doctors, was able for the first time to do some mission work in Fiji on local patients with advanced venous disease. The enterprise was supported strongly by our industry partners - Medisol, Device Consulting, Sigvaris, Clinical Imaging and Fujifilm Sonosite, with provision of equipment such as endovenous laser ultrasound devices, machines. Radiofrequency generators and compression garments. As well photographic as documentation.

There was a large team of volunteers including doctors, sonographers, nurses and the youth volunteers. In all, 14 patients were treated and we were able to start educating local doctors in minimally invasive venous procedures. We hope to be able to continue this work in the future.

Next year's meeting is on the Gold Coast from 9-12th May. It would be great to see you all there.

On the 30th April 2024 the College embarked on a Mission, to teach doctors in Fiji about the field of Phlebology. The mission was funded through the Phlebology Foundation of Australia and organised by Dr Stefania Roberts and Dr Stephen Benson, both Board Members of the ACP. The day was a great success, with further assistance from Dr Lisa Marks, Dr Kurosh Parsi and Dr Joseph Grace, together with their dedicated teams, including Dr Manisha Siriwadene, Nicole Curtis, Tony Nguyen, Andy Nguyen, Yana Parsi and Parmiss Parsi. Patients were treated with Endothermal Ablation procedures, with the Fijian doctors participating and learning these techniques.

Dr Zen Low of Zen's Clinic, generously opened his clinic for the teams to take over and treat patients while providing valuable instruction to those Fijian doctors present.

Without the help of Youth Without A Mission (YWAM) this mission would not have been possible. They were the go-to team in Fiji that brought everyone together and ensured that all equipment and supplies were able to safely enter the country to ensure the day was a success.

Our trade partners were overly generous with the following donations:

- Sigvaris donated 2 suitcases full of compression stockings and funds
- A Fujifilm Sonosite ultrasound machine was donated to the Zen clinic
- Clarius bought a 15MHz POCUS to be used for the mission
- Medline gifted vascular packs
- Device Consulting brought a 1500nm laser, 5 laser fibers and a Klein pump
- Medisol brought their laser machine
- Medtronic brought 2 radiofrequency generators and 12 RFA fibers to be used, plus vascular packs
- Laureth-9 was donated for UGS
